



CBAA National Volunteer Week Competition 2024 Terms & Conditions

1. The CBAA National Volunteer Week competition is open to anyone who:
 - Is a volunteer of a community radio station that: (a) Holds a temporary or permanent community radio license, and (b) Is a member of the CBAA;
 - Is an Australian citizen, permanent resident or holder of a humanitarian visa;
 - Has the approval of their station to attend the conference.
2. The scholarship for the winner of the CBAA National Volunteer Week competition is limited to 1 person. CBAA will pick the winner from the nominations submitted at its discretion. Preference will be given to applicants who meet one or more of the following criteria: are under the age of 26, belong to an underrepresented gender, are affiliated with a station in a regional, rural, or remote area, or represent a station that did not attend the 2024 CBAA Conference, with their attendance likely to benefit their home station;
3. Nominations must be received by 11:59pm Sunday 26 May 2024 to be eligible. The winner will be announced the following week;
4. CBAA will cover the cost of conference registration for the winner, which includes a ticket to the Welcome BBQ, CBAA Awards Gala Dinner and accommodation at the conference venue to the value of \$1,200 for the CBAA National Volunteer Week winner;
5. Conference registration includes access to the workshops and panels as listed on the program, and morning and afternoon tea and lunch during the Conference;
6. Accommodation is booked by the CBAA at a venue close to the conference venue for three nights, checking in on Thursday, 17 October 2024 and checking out Sunday, 20 October 2024. Accommodation includes breakfast daily. Any additional nights must be booked and paid for by scholarship recipients;
7. The winner will not receive the value of the scholarship in cash;
8. The winner is responsible for costs above and beyond the \$1,200 scholarship, which may include flights and transfers, extra accommodation costs (e.g.

Mini Bar or additional nights), meals outside of conference catering, and incidentals;

9. If the winner is unable to attend for any reason, they must inform the CBAA with at least 21 days' notice prior to the conference to enable the scholarship to be reallocated. The original recipient will be responsible for covering any costs associated with cancellation, such as flights;
10. Scholarship recipients must be over the age of 18 to attend the conference and associated events;
11. Scholarship recipients may be asked to submit a testimonial following the conference for future promotional and funding purposes.
